NCFE (Northern Council for Further Education) is a national educational awarding body that designs, develops, and certifies diverse, recognised vocational qualifications and awards. NCFE is the UK's longest established awarding body, as well as one of the UK's fastest growing.

NCFE qualifications are available at various levels. Level 1 and 2 are equivalent to GCSEs, Level 3 to A-Levels, and Level 4 to 7 hold the same status of achievement as a degree. Harnessing the power and resources of Arsenal FC, we can provide our students with a high quality, holistic experience tailored to their individual needs and specific career interests through NCFE qualifications.





HOW ARE OUR NCFE QUALIFICATIONS ASSESSED?

NCFE LEVEL 2 DIPLOMA IN SPORT

YEAR COURSE





COURSE INFORMATION

The NCFE Level 2 Diploma in Sport (Sport, Exercise & Fitness Pathway) is intended for learners aged 16+ and prepares learners for higher education and gives a good introduction to the sport vocation.

It is designed as a 1-year, full time course that is equivalent to four GCSEs (from Grade 4 to 9) and will provide the foundation to continue education at Level 3.



Four GCSEs at Grade 3 or above, including English Language and Maths.

UNITS OF STUDY

Includes three mandatory and four optional units over the 1 year:

- Participating in Sport
- Introduction to Healthy Exercise & Nutrition
- Anatomy & Physiology
- Developing Sporting Skill & Tactical Awareness
- Psychology for Sports Performance
- Sports Coaching
- Performance Analysis for Sport

COURSE INFORMATION

The NCFE Level 3 Extended Diploma in Sport & Physical Activity (Sports Coaching Pathway) is intended for learners aged 16+ and prepares learners for further education, apprenticeships, or sport based employment.

It is designed as a 2-year, full time course that is equivalent to three A-Levels and provides the following UCAS points: P-48, M-98, D-144, D*-168.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Five GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including English Language and Maths.

COACH EDUCATION

The coach education element to our post-16 courses has been meticulously designed to provide our students with the unique opportunity to cultivate essential skills and attain qualifications spanning various aspects of the sports world, be it coaching and teaching, officiating, or performance support.

Our students will actively engage in weekly practical coach education sessions and gain invaluable work experience, all facilitated by FA and UEFA certified football coaches. Our curriculum is aligned with the FA's England DNA philosophy, ensuring a seamless progression for our students as they undertake FA qualifications.

Students also are provided with an insight into coach education in a variety of different sports to broaden their coaching understanding.





WORK EXPERIENCE

Throughout the course, work experience assumes a pivotal role in the holistic development of our students. Some of the exciting opportunities that past students have pursued include:

GCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE & MATHS

Students who are yet to achieve a Grade 4 or above in GCSE English Language and/or Maths prior to starting their studies with us will be required to continue to study the GCSE subject(s) alongside their NCFE sport qualification.

We know that GCSE English Language and Maths can be challenging for many students, and we therefore provide as much support as possible to help our students to overcome that challenge. The GCSE lessons are embedded into the weekly timetable and are delivered on-site at the Arsenal Hub by expert teachers who specialise within those subjects.

Students will have access to a variety of smart, easy to use applications, and dedicated exam support as they prepare for the GCSE Summer Series.

SELECTION PROCESS & NEXT STEPS



O1 OPEN EVENING

Express an interest online via our website and we will invite you to one of our open evenings, where we will give you all the information you need about your desired course.



02 APPLICATION

Complete our online application form in as much detail as possible via our website (www.arsenal.com/thearsenalstudent). The education team will review your application and invite you to an interview if entry requirements are met.



03 INTERVIEW

You will need to attend an interview at the Arsenal Hub, where our education team will ask you a series of questions to get to know you better and understand your reasoning for applying.



04 CONDITIONAL OFFER

If you have been successful at the interview, a conditional offer will be made on the basis that you meet the academic entry requirements. before officially being accepted onto the course.



05 PRE-INDUCTION

You will be invited to a pre-induction at the Arsenal Hub during the summer break where you will be able to familiarise yourself with your surroundings, understand the course in more detail, and meet your new classmates.



05 GCSE RESULTS

GCSE grades on results day should be sent to the education team who will review them and ensure that the course you have applied for is still suitable for your next steps. or if another course may be more appropriate.
