THE GUNNERS FUND

TERMS OF REFERENCE AND GRANT-MAKING GUIDELINES

1. About the Gunners Fund

The Arsenal Foundation has committed £50,000 per annum to fund community projects in the local area of Islington, Camden and Hackney. This fund, known as the "Gunners Fund", aims to maximise the local reach and impact of The Foundation by offering smaller grants that can make a big difference to projects and causes in Arsenal FC's local area.

2. Purpose

In line with the overall objectives of The Foundation, priority will be given to the following areas of need:

- Education (including academic, social, physical education, skills training and community engagement);
- Sports capable of improving health;
- Medical;
- Sickness and the relief of suffering;
- Disability;
- Poverty; and
- Individual misfortune.

(There is also an over-riding requirement that all grants contribute to the public benefit.)

3. Geographical Area

Applications will be accepted from beneficiaries in Islington, Camden and Hackney.

4. Size of Grant

The Gunners Fund will make grants of up to £2,500 (the amount of grant awarded will be determined at the discretion of the Trustees of The Arsenal Foundation on a case by case basis). In the event that the Trustees believe that a grant in excess of £2,500 may be appropriate, the application will be considered in accordance with The Foundation's overall grant-making guidelines which can be found here:

5. Potential Beneficiaries

The following is a non-exhaustive list of potential beneficiaries or groups of beneficiaries:

- Organisations connected to Arsenal FC;
- Charity or community projects connected to Arsenal FC;
- Community groups, societies or projects;
- Projects that have been developed by Arsenal FC's community team;
- Staff-initiated projects;
- Supporter-initiated projects;
- Projects where The Foundation's donation, even though relatively small, will make a difference;
- Projects where the gesture of support from a charity associated with Arsenal FC can have a
 greater effect than the money itself;
- Football-linked campaigns or public bodies;
- Projects where the person requesting a donation is doing something active to raise money for the cause;
- Projects where the person is playing a significant and voluntary role in raising money for the charity; and
- Awards to reward success or achievement in areas of endeavour that fall within the objectives of The Foundation.

6. Application Process

- Applications should be made using the Application Template and submitted via e-mail to <u>ssingh@arsenal.co.uk</u> or via post to Highbury House, 75 Drayton Park, London, N5 1BU for the attention of Samir Singh.
- The Foundation has established a committee, including members of the local community, Arsenal supporters and staff. The Gunners Fund Committee ("GFC") will assist with the assessment of applications and make recommendations to the Trustees as appropriate.
- As part of its assessment of an application, the GFC may contact the applicant to request further information and/or may arrange to visit the applicant where appropriate.
- The decision whether to award a grant, and the amount of such grant, will be made by two Trustees, taking into consideration any feedback or recommendations from the committee.
- In the event of an application being successful, The Foundation will confirm grant offers in writing, setting out the amount and purpose of the grant; the arrangements for payment; and any monitoring or publicity arrangements (see below).
- Please note that, due to the volume of applications we receive for the Gunners Fund, The Arsenal Foundation is unable to respond to all applications. If you have not received a response within 2 months unfortunately your application has been unsuccessful.

7. Monitoring and Publicity

- The Foundation may wish to monitor the effectiveness of grants made from the Gunners Fund, and may implement appropriate evaluation procedures as the Trustees see fit.
- The Foundation may also wish to publicise grants made from the Gunners Fund, and (whilst The
 Foundation will endeavour to make this a collaborative process) by accepting a grant,
 beneficiaries consent to The Foundation doing so without prior notice to the beneficiary.
